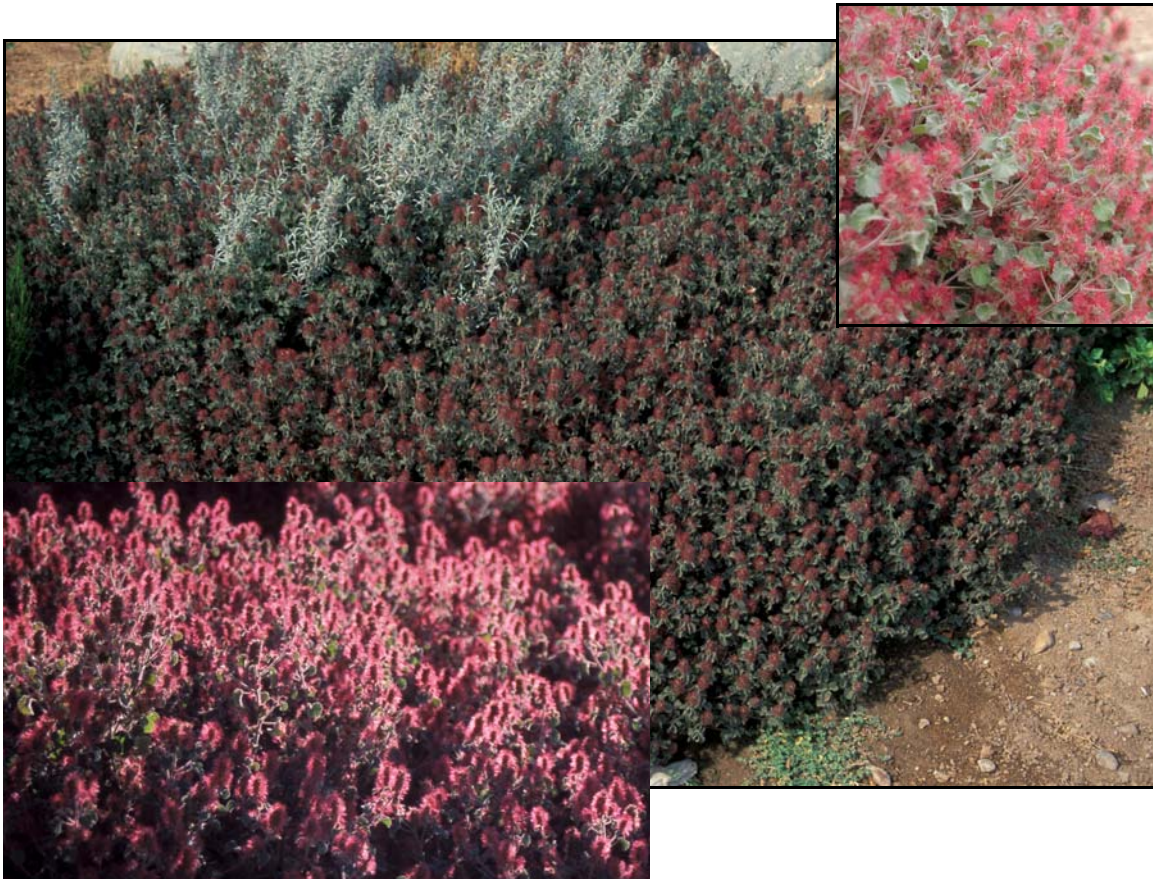




## ACALYPHA MONOSTACHYA RASPBERRY FUZZIES™

The striking copper foliage of this low mounding perennial provides a unique color for low desert landscapes. Pink-red blossoms are produced from April through November. These fuzzy balls glow when backlit by the sun! This member of the Euphorbia family is native to the Chihuahuan Desert of west central Texas and northern Mexico. It has proven to be a very adaptable groundcover, tolerating poor soils, full sun, heat and moderate cold. The only down side to this little gem is that it defoliates after the first frost. However, plants re-grow quickly in the spring to form a low mound to 6 inches tall by 3-4 feet wide. Cut plants back to ground level after the first frost to improve their cold-weather appearance. Raspberry Fuzzies™ prefers well-drained soils and full sun, and is root hardy to 10°F. USDA Zone 7.
