



## AGAVE GUIENGOLA

Brighten up a shady spot with this bold succulent! *Agave guiengola* has broad white-grey leaves to 22 inches long by 6 inches wide. Only a few leaves are produced, resulting in a flat, open growth form to 3 feet tall by 4 feet wide. This species produces offsets when young, but fewer as the plant ages. It is very shade tolerant, and in fact prefers some shade in the low deserts. Consider using *Agave guiengola* in those difficult dry, shady spots of the garden. It is fairly frost tender, exhibiting damage in Phoenix at temperatures below 25° F. *Agave guiengola* is native to Oaxaca, Mexico at elevations from 300 to 2000 feet.
