



## AGAVE LOPHANTHA CENTER STRIPE AGAVE

This agave forms irregular colonies of small succulent plants that grow to about 2' tall by 3' wide. This plant will have a slow to moderate growth rate depending on culture and care. The sword-like green leaves are stiff, glossy, with a light stripe down the center. Leaves have thorns on the margins and a sharp terminal spine. The flower spike is unbranched to 12' tall, with greenish-yellow flowers. The Center Stripe Agave is native to south Texas and south into eastern Mexico. It prefers well-drained soils, and full sun to partial shade. Hardy to 10 °F. USDA Zone 7.
