



AGAVE MACROACANTHA

This small clumping agave has stunning narrow powder blue leaves tipped with an impressive black-brown spine. Mature plants will grow to about 2 feet tall and wide. The unbranched flower stalk has green flowers and may also produce bulbils or tiny plantlets. In milder climates this plant grows well in full sun, but in the low deserts some afternoon shade is preferred. This symmetrical agave is perfect for use in pots on patios and in the smaller urban gardens. It is native to the Mexican states of Oaxaca and Puebla. Hardy to 25° F. USDA Zone 9.
