



AGAVE PARRYI V. PARRYI PARRY'S AGAVE

This highly prized succulent is native from central Arizona into New Mexico and south to the states of Chihuahua, Durango and Guanajuato, Mexico. It produces larger leaves and rosettes than the subspecies *Agave parryi* var. *couesii* but is smaller than *Agave parryi* var. *huachuensis*. The compact, nearly round rosettes consist of gray-green lanceolate leaves 7 to 20 inches in length. Leaves have marginal teeth as well as a stout spine on the tip. A single specimen eventually forms colonies of many offsets. As with most agaves, the mother plant will die after flowering. Hardy to -20°F. USDA Zone 5.
