



AGAVE SCABRA ROUGH-LEAVED AGAVE

Agave scabra has thick, wide, gray-green leaves that are rough on the back. The leaves are edged with recurved teeth and end in a stout terminal spine. Although there is great variation in the wild, the selection we are growing forms a rosette to 4 feet tall and wide, and suckers freely. It is a smaller alternative to *Agave americana*. *Agave scabra* is abundant in the Chihuahuan Desert region of northeastern Mexico, at elevations from 3600 to 5700 feet. Plants will thrive in full sun and reflected heat. *Agave scabra* is hardy to 0° F. USDA Zone 6.
