



ALOE SAPONARIA TIGER ALOE

The fleshy lance-shaped green leaves of this aloe are dappled with white spots, and they develop a red tinge as the weather cools. The leaves are arranged in a rosette and numerous offsets or pups are produced that can form dense colonies. The showy flowers are red-pink to orange, occurring winter through summer on 3-foot-tall candelabras. The individual flowers dangle, giving this aloe an exotic effect. If plants become unsightly the clumps may be thinned. This aloe is subject to aloe mites and the leaves may exhibit tip burn. It prefers good drainage and protection from afternoon sun. The sap may irritate some people. It is sometimes called Soap Aloe.
