



## BAHIA ABSINTHIFOLIA BAHIA

This herbaceous perennial groundcover is native to rocky slopes from west Texas to southeastern Arizona. Plants are roughly one foot in diameter, with linear leaves about 2 inches long with a silvery cast and three clefts. The flowers are yellow, daisy-like to 1" across. Tolerant of full sun and drought, some additional moisture will keep this plant constantly in bloom in the low desert from spring until late fall. It is known for its fast growth rate and ability to reseed. It also spreads by underground rhizomes. This tough little plant even grows in shallow caliche. It may be cut to the ground each spring for fresh regrowth to about 1 foot tall. Hardy to 15° F. USDA Zone 8.
