

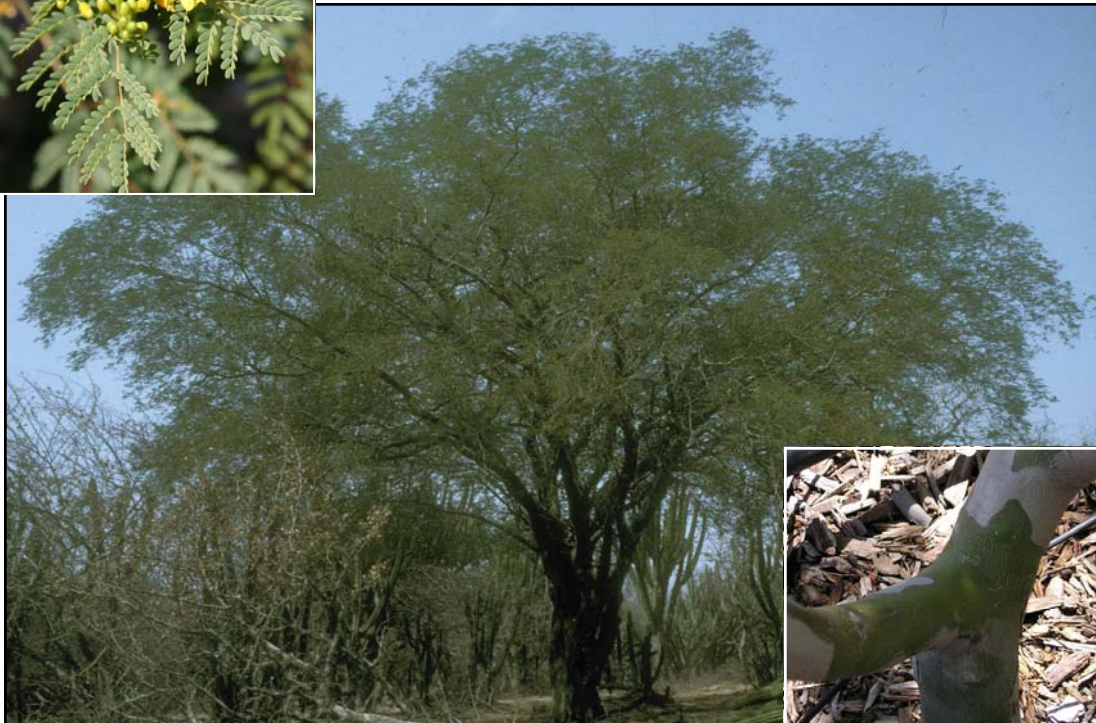


## CAESALPINIA PARAGUARIENSIS GUAYACAN; TRANQUILITY TREE

This woody tree is native to the semi-arid regions of South America. Its branches have a wispy, weepy character. It is usually evergreen in milder climates, with doubly compound leaves that emerge as a rust color, gradually turning bright green. Small clusters of bright yellow flowers lend a sparkly appearance in the spring and summer. Smooth, attractive woody seedpods turn from brown to black. Perhaps the most endearing quality of this tree is the mottled bark, with shades of green, beige, gray and brown flecking off in patches. The combination of wispy foliage, smooth mottled bark and tactile, zen-like pods inspired the name Tranquility Tree. Mature size is variable, with specimens reaching 15 to 30 feet in height and width. Virtually no issues with disease, insects or rabbits. Hardy to 18° F. USDA Zone 8.
