



CALLIANDRA ERIOPHYLLA PINK FAIRY DUSTER

This tough native shrub occurs on rocky hills from California to Texas at elevations from 2000 to 5000 feet. Tiny ferny green-gray compound leaves drop in the winter or in extreme drought to expose the densely-branched form. Dark pink to white powder puff flowers appear for a short time in the spring and intermittently through rest of year in response to moisture. Mature plants will be 3 feet in height and as wide. It is considered quite cold, heat and drought tolerant. It should be planted in well-drained soil and full sun.
