



CHRYSOETHAMNUS VISCIDIFLORUS GREEN RABBITBRUSH

Green rabbitbrush is very similar to the Whitestem Chamisa, *Ericameria nauseosus*, but this rabbitbrush is usually smaller, to about 3-4 feet tall and wide. It has narrow green leaves that are sticky to the touch. Butterflies are attracted to the masses of golden flowers that appear in the fall. It occurs across the southwestern U.S. and into Canada, at elevations from 5000 to 10,500 feet. It is hardy to -40° F, and thrives on infertile, eroded soils. Rabbits use this plant for food and shelter, and birds feed on the seeds.
