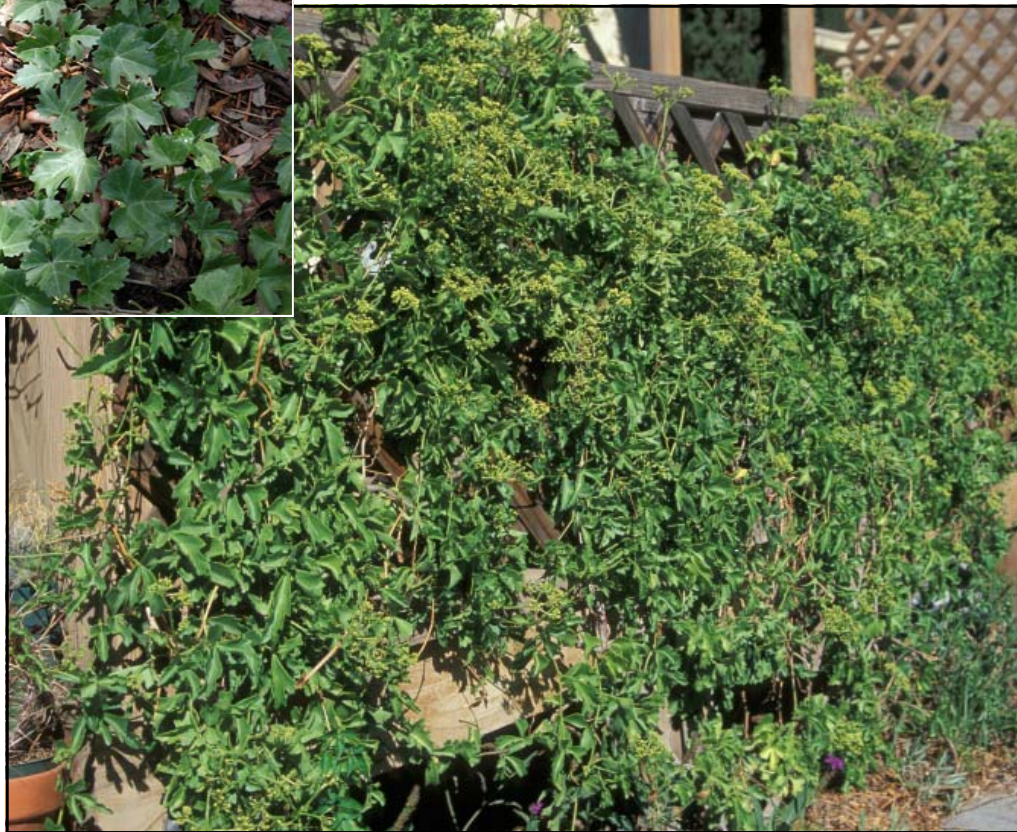




## CISSUS TRIFOLIATA V. INCISA GRAPE IVY

Native to Arizona and Mexico at elevations of 3,000 – 5,000 feet, this slow growing deciduous vine may extend to 20 feet. If no support is provided it will crawl on the ground, rooting from the nodes, but will climb with the use of tendrils if given a chance. The growth rate is dependent on available water, and it may be rapid, or even invasive in some cases. The three-lobed leaves are somewhat fleshy and may cause skin irritation for some people. The inconspicuous flowers are followed by small, black inedible fruit. It grows well in full sun or part shade. Hardy to -10° F.
