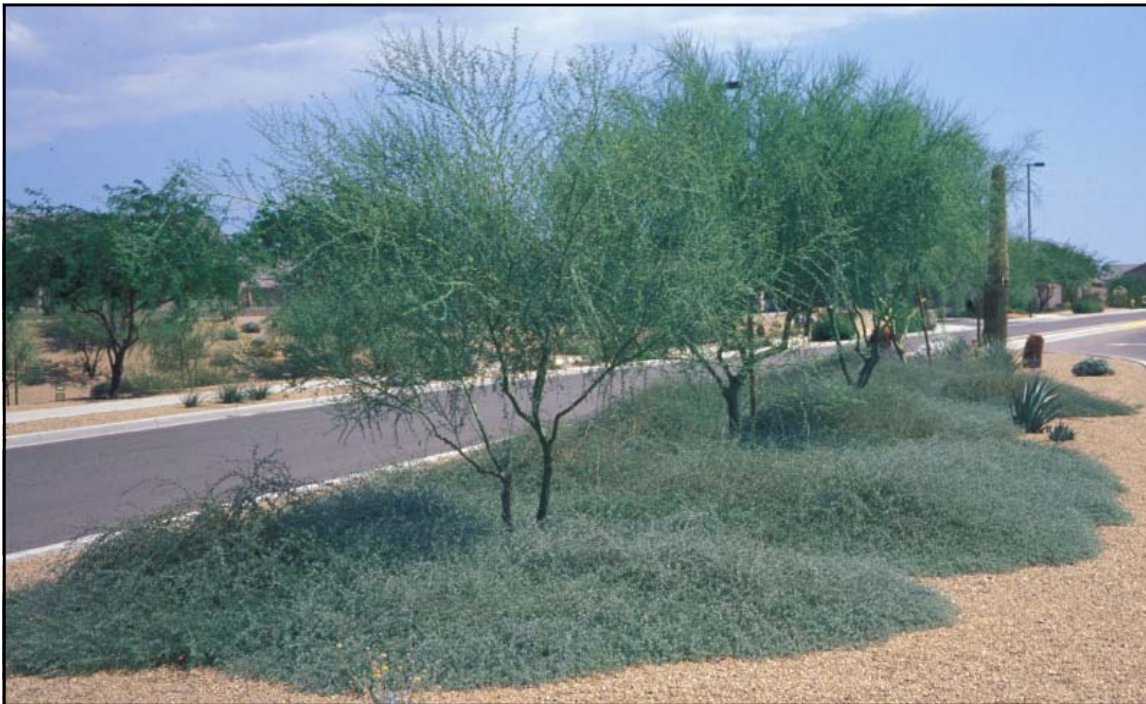




DALEA GREGGII TRAILING INDIGO BUSH

This long-lived, durable ground cover requires almost no maintenance. *Dalea greggii* is a ground cover that thrives in full sun and reflected heat locations, forming a dense silvery mound to only one to two feet tall. The fuzzy purple flower balls produced in the spring and early summer are not overly showy, although the bees seem to like them. Trailing indigo bush is a great choice for steep banks, or other areas where erosion control is needed. It is notorious for looking scraggly in nursery containers, but don't let that discourage you from trying it. Once established, it's one of the hardiest ground covers available! Just be careful not to mix this ground cover with water-loving plants, as it is susceptible to rotting out if over-watered.
