



ERIGERON KARVINSKIANUS 'PROFUSION' SANTA BARBARA DAISY

Santa Barbara daisy is a versatile perennial that performs well in low and high deserts. Part shade is recommended in hot locations, but it can handle full sun at higher elevations. 'Profusion', a cultivar of a Mexican species, blooms heavily with small white daisy-like flowers. In low deserts the flower production is heaviest in the spring and fall, while summer color is the norm in colder climates. This spreading perennial grows quickly to about 12 inches tall by 2 to 3 feet wide. It has bright green, fine textured foliage that fits well into lush landscapes. Because it needs moderate to ample irrigation, it is most suited to oasis zones. 'Profusion' can be cut back in the winter to remove any scruffy foliage. If ample water is available, this plant can reseed in the landscape. Hardy to -10° F. USDA Zone 5.
