



ERIOGONUM FASCICULATUM V. POLIOFOLIUM FLATTOP BUCKWHEAT

Flattop Buckwheat is a clumping, grass-like plant with a naturally low-rounded form growing to 1.5' tall by 2' wide. The smallish leaves are dark green and are covered in a white woolly down on the underside. White to pink flowers appear in dense flattened clusters throughout the summer. This plant is tolerant of drought and heat. Flattop buckwheat is native on dry rocky slopes from 1000 to 4500 feet across Southern California, Utah and Arizona. It is adaptable to most soil conditions, but prefers coarse well-drained soils. It is hardy to 15° F.
