



## ERIOGONUM WRIGHTII WRIGHT BUCKWHEAT

Wright's buckwheat is a perennial subshrub that grows across a wide range in the United States, from California to Texas. It occurs in gravelly, rocky locations at elevations from 3,000 to 7,000 feet. Most plants are less than 2 feet in height and width. Small ½" long, gray leaves cover the lower portion of the plant, while clusters of white to pink flowers are held above the foliage on long stalks during summer and early fall. Plant in full sun and well-drained soil. Hardy to 0°F. USDA Zone 6.
