



## FENDLERA RUPICOLA CLIFF FENDLERBUSH

This member of the Hydrangea family is sometimes called false mock-orange due to the highly fragrant blossoms. Fendlerbush is a deciduous vase-shaped shrub that occurs on limestone soils in Texas, Colorado, Utah and Arizona. It is open and upright, and its wiry stems are sparsely foliated with small pairs of leathery leaves. The slightly fragrant, four petaled, white flowers are tinged with pink. Incidentally, rupicola means “lover of rocks”. Due to its strong tap root, cliff fendlerbush is quite drought tolerant.
