



## GLANDULARIA TENUISECTA 'EDITH' (VERBENA TENUISECTA 'EDITH')

In verbena trials performed several years ago at the nursery, 'Edith' out-performed the rest of the pack, blooming throughout the warm months with masses of lavender pink blossoms. This fine-textured verbena was discovered in North Carolina, in Edith Eddleman's garden. It forms a low, spreading mound of bright green foliage to 6-8 inches tall by 4-5 feet wide. This plant loves full sun situations and thrives in the heat, although it usually burns back in the hottest low desert summers. Fall planting is ideal, to allow for complete establishment before the heat hits. Some frost damage may occur if temperatures drop below 20° F. USDA Zone 9.
