



HAVARDIA MEXICANA MEXICAN EBONY

Synonym: *Pithecellobium mexicana*. This tree is larger, faster growing and less dense than Texas ebony, *Ebenopsis ebano*. It has a naturally rounded form at maturity. The fine-textured foliage is grey-green in color. Creamy yellow puff-ball flowers are produced in the spring, followed by long woody brown pods. This tree is native to Sonora and Baja California at elevations from 500 to 2500 feet. It prefers loose, well-drained soil, and the amount of irrigation will determine its rate of growth.
