

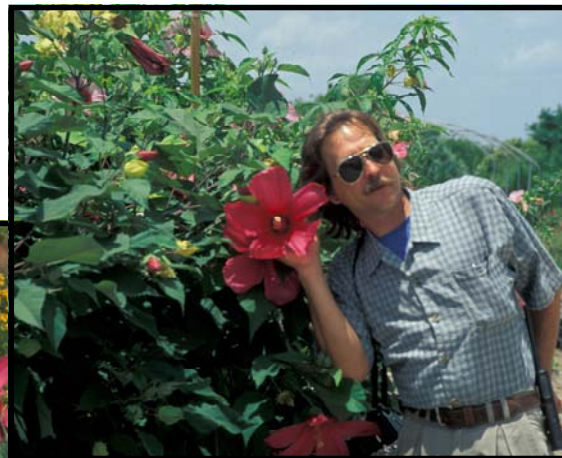


HIBISCUS X 'MOY GRANDE'

'Moy Grande' is a unique hibiscus hybrid, with stunning open-faced pink flowers up to one foot across. It reaches a mature size of about 5 feet tall and wide in a growing season. It generally freezes back to the ground in the winter. During the bloom season the branches can become so heavily weighed down with flowers that the shrub opens up in the center. Plant 'Moy Grande' in full sun for the most spectacular flower display. Rich, moist soil is also ideal for healthy growth and heavy bloom. It is the largest flowered perennial rose mallow hibiscus in existence, and was bred by Mr. Ying Doon Moy, formerly of the San Antonio Botanical Garden. It is a cross between *Hibiscus grandiflorus* and *Hibiscus mocheutos*. Hardy to -10° F. USDA Zone 6.
