



# LONICERA X AMERICANA 'PAM'S PINK' PAM'S PINK HONEYSUCKLE

This relatively new introduction is promoted as a Texas SuperStar™ by the Texas A & M Department of Agriculture. This tough vine has all the desirable traits of common honeysuckle but without the problems of powdery mildew and potential invasiveness. The plants are covered with two-lipped, elongated flowers we recognize for the genus, in pastel hues of cream and pink. The lightly scented blossoms are sure to attract nectar seeking insects and birds from mid-spring into the fall. Tolerant of alkalinity, salinity, heat and drought once established, this twining shrub will win a favorite spot in your garden. The blue-green foliage has a waxy surface, an obvious reason they are so tough in desert conditions. 'Pam's Pink' is somewhat bushy in appearance, growing to 4-5 feet tall by 6 feet wide. It is useful as a filler plant, container plant, or planted into large informal borders. Plants may be cut back periodically to maintain size and shape and to encourage vigorous new shoots. USDA Zone 7.
