



MIMULUS CARDINALIS SCARLET MONKEY FLOWER

Monkey flower is ideal for shady, damp garden locations. It is native along streambeds in California, Utah, Nevada, Arizona and Oregon. In late spring and early summer it produces unusual orange-red flowers that some say resemble a monkey face. The flowers attract hummingbirds. This herbaceous perennial grows to about 2 feet tall by 2 to 3 feet wide, with large green leaves. It is adapted to both low and high deserts, as long as it receives ample irrigation and afternoon shade.
