



## PENSTEMON AMPHORELLAE MEXICAN BLUE PENSTEMON

This low, sprawling perennial begins its floral display in late spring, producing 15 to 18-inch tall spikes of large, light blue flowers. Fine-textured light green leaves provide a nice backdrop for the soft blue flowers. This fast-growing native of Coahuilla, Mexico prefers full sun to part shade exposures, and requires moderate irrigation to look its best. It often reseeds in landscape settings. Mexican Blue Penstemon suffers in hot, dry summer regions, performing best in areas with cooler night temperatures. Hummingbirds are attracted to the nectar in the tubular blossoms.
