



PLATANUS WRIGHTII ARIZONA SYCAMORE

The Arizona Sycamore occurs along streambeds and rocky canyons of Arizona, New Mexico and into northwestern New Mexico at elevations of 2,000 to 6,000 feet. The light green leaves may be 10 inches across, with 5 to 7 lobes and a smooth margin. The inconspicuous flowers are separately sexed occurring on the same tree, followed by rounded, bristly seed heads in clusters of 2 to 4. The magnificent bark is a smooth white-gray, with brown patches that peel from the trunk. Often trees are multi-trunked specimens, forming large, broad crowns. Hardy to -10. USDA Zone 6.
