



SALVIA DORRII VAR. DORRII DESERT SAGE

The combination of silver foliage and round clusters of blue-purple flowers make Desert sage a lovely little ornamental. Desert sage is adapted to a wide range of temperatures, growing from 2000 to 7000 foot elevations in Nevada, Arizona, and California. It is very cold hardy, yet handles the heat in low deserts better than most salvias. This aromatic shrub is evergreen, with small, rounded silver leaves growing along stiff branches. Desert sage is small in stature and fits into most landscape situations. In the late winter and spring the plant is covered with whorls of blue flowers. Plant Desert sage in full sun and extremely well drained soil.
