



## TEUCRIUM CHAMAEDRYIS 'PROSTRATUM' PROSTRATE GERMANDER

This low growing, evergreen groundcover is native to the rocky, dry hillsides of the Mediterranean. Lower growing than the species, this prostrate form will be 1 to 3 feet tall and as wide. The dark green leaves are small and serrate. Spikes of reddish purple flowers adorn the plants in the spring, and intermittently throughout the cooler part of the year. Plants respond well to pruning and thinning in the late winter months and a second shearing following the floral show to remove spent blossom spikes is recommended. It will not survive poor drainage or overwatering.
