



UNGNADIA SPECIOSA MEXICAN BUCKEYE

Typically a large shrub or small tree, this great plant will eventually reach a mature size of 15 feet by 15 feet. Although winter deciduous, spring brings lovely rose-pink flowers before the leaves emerge. The large dark green, compound leaves have a yellow fall color. Native to central, southern and west Texas, the buckeye will withstand heat and drought once established, but requires good drainage. It will well perform in full sun and partial shade.
