



YUCCA CONSTRICTA

This short, clumping yucca is native to south central and west Texas, and into adjacent Mexico. At its largest, *Yucca constricta* might develop a 1-foot-tall trunk, forming a low-growing clump with up to 20 heads. Its flexible, pale green leaves are about 2 feet long by 1 inch wide, with white threads along the margins. Flowering occurs from spring through the summer. The top half of the spectacular 5-foot tall flower spike is covered with large greenish-white blossoms. It is hardy to 0° F.
