



YUCCA THOMPSONIANA THOMPSON'S YUCCA

The native habitat for this yucca ranges from northern Mexico through west Texas and into southeastern New Mexico. A small trunk-forming species, it grows slowly to 6 feet tall by 6 feet wide, developing multiple branches. Short foot-long leaves are blue-green in color, with serrated margins and a sharp terminal spine. Early summer is the bloom season, with 3 to 5-foot-tall flower spikes covered with large white flowers rising above the foliage. Plant in full sun and well-drained soils, and do not overwater. Hardy to -20° F. USDA Zone 5.
