



AMBROSIA DUMOSA WHITE BURSAE

This small shrub is native to much of the Southwest, at elevations from 500 to 3500 feet. It is a staple for revegetation projects in areas where it is the main understory plant. The small gray leaves are covered with short white hairs. The insignificant flowers produce abundant pollen, which can be a nuisance for allergy sufferers. The flowers are followed by prickly burs. It requires well-drained soil, full sun exposures, and some supplemental irrigation until established in the landscape. Hardy to 10° F. USDA Zone 7.
