



## CEREUS HILDMANNIANUS syn. C. PERUVIANUS HEDGE CACTUS

Native to South America, this shrub cactus produces a clump of thick, ribbed, blue-green cylindrical branches. Specimens may attain heights of 20 feet and form clumps 15 feet across. Most plants display needle-like spines on the branches. Large, fragrant white funnel-shaped flowers open at night during the summer months. This cactus tolerates full sun, but performs best in afternoon shade. It is not tolerant of heavy, wet soils. Hardy to 25° F. USDA Zone 9.
