



CHAMAEBATIARIA MILLEFOLIUM FERNBUSH

During the middle of summer Fernbush provides a refreshing display of large white flower clusters. Butterflies and bees are attracted to the lilac-like blossoms. This long-lived shrub is semi-evergreen, with fragrant, light green ferny foliage. As it matures, it develops flaky, reddish bark. Fernbush usually grows to about 5 feet tall and wide, although it has the potential to reach 8 feet. After flowering, large brown seed heads are formed. These can be removed for a cleaner appearance. Native to the western U.S., at elevations of 4000 to 7000 feet, Fernbush is cold hardy to -30° F. Plant Fernbush in well-drained soil and full sun exposures. It will suffer in the intense heat of low desert summers. USDA Zone 4.
