



CORDIA BOISSIERI MEXICAN OLIVE

Native from southern Texas into Mexico, this evergreen shrub or small tree is underutilized in the Southwest. It will eventually grow to 25 to 30 feet tall by 25 feet wide. The deep green leaves are large, leathery and coarse in texture. White 2" diameter flowers with yellow throats are borne in clusters from spring through fall. The small edible fruit resembles an olive. Abundant flower and seed litter should be expected. Plants thrive in full sun and reflected heat locations. The rate of growth is dependent on the amount of irrigation. Hardy to 20°F, USDA Zone 9.
