



## CORTADERIA SELLOANA 'PUMILA' DWARF PAMPAS GRASS

Most residential landscapes are too small for the full-sized Pampas Grass, so consider this dwarf version, which tops out at 4-6 feet tall and wide. It produces tall flower stalks bearing large fluffy chartreuse to white plumes in the summer. The old plumes will remain through winter, adding to the effect. To our knowledge, this dwarf variety is thought to be sterile. Leaves are strap-like and arching; medium to light green ; fading to tan in the winter. The leaf margins are sharp so care should be taken with placement. It is adaptable to wet, heavy clay soils, as well as dry or sandy soils. It also tolerates variable pH levels, salt and wind. The foliage should be cut to the ground in early spring. If subjected to overhead irrigation or high humidity, fungal deterioration of the flower stalks can result. It is resistant to Cotton Root Rot. Hardy to 0° F.
