



**EBENOPSIS EBANO syn. PITHECELLOBIUM FLEXICAULE
TEXAS EBONY**

Texas ebony is a large evergreen shrub or small tree, ranging in size from 15 feet to 40 feet tall and wide. Its dark, glossy green compound leaves are arranged along thorny branches with a distinctive zig-zag pattern. Creamy yellow, fragrant clusters of flowers are produced from May to October. Flowers are followed by large woody pods. This native of the Rio Grande plains of south Texas prefers well-drained sites in full or partial sun. It is extremely drought tolerant. Hardy to 10° F. USDA Zone 7.
