



HESPERALOE NOCTURNA NIGHT-BLOOMING HESPERALOE

This evergreen plant forms a dense rosette of narrow, grasslike leaves up to 4 feet long. They are deeply channeled, with fine white threads along the margins. Its is a summer bloomer, producing small greenish-lavender flowers on a 12 foot tall stalk. The flowers open at night. Night-blooming Hesperaloe may be planted in part shade or full sun, but requires well-drained soil. It is a very low maintenance plant. Although it is quite drought tolerant, a thorough watering every two weeks during the warm months is recommended.
