



HILARIA RIGIDA BIG GALLETA

Big galleta is a perennial, shrub-like grass most often used for erosion control and revegetation. This native of North America usually occurs in sandy soils up to 5000 feet in elevation. It has a rough appearance; with coarse blue-green leaves forming a dense clump. From spring through fall it produces slender, dense spikes of greenish flowers. Big galleta is fast growing, long-lived, and very drought tolerant. It should be planted in full sun and well-drained soil, and cut to the ground every few years. Be aware that this grass is allergenic.
