



LARREA TRIDENTATA CREOSOTE BUSH

The aromatic foliage of this southwest native evokes the scent of rain in the desert! Found virtually throughout the flatlands of the arid West, this tough evergreen shrub is always a favorite in native gardens. In the wild it has an open form with sparse foliage on woody stems. Irrigated plants will be much more lush and grow faster. It is a durable plant that can provide a solid foundation to the landscape. Yellow flowers may be produced throughout the year, but occur primarily in the spring. The flowers are followed by small fuzzy seedpods. For best results plant in full sun and in well-drained soils.
