



OPUNTIA FICUS-INDICA INDIAN FIG

This large padded cactus slowly becomes tree-like, with succulent green pads on stout woody trunks. Older specimens may become quite large often attaining heights of 15 feet and as wide as 10 feet. The flat, bright green pads bear clusters of glochids but few if any spines. Large yellow to orange flowers are produced in late spring followed by large yellow-red edible, fleshy fruits known as “tunas”. Young pads may be cooked and consumed too. Indian Fig may be grown in full sun to part shade and well-drained soils.
