



POLIOMINTHA MADERENSIS LAVENDER SPICE™

This small, woody shrub has small, bright green leaves with a delicious oregano fragrance. It forms a rounded, somewhat irregular mound to 3 feet tall. Beginning in April, and continuing into September, showy clusters of lavender flowers are produced at the tips of the branches. Once established, Lavender Spice™ is drought-tolerant, but flowers more profusely if given supplemental water during the bloom period. It is tolerant of a wide range of soil types, and will thrive in either full sun or light shade. Maintenance is minimal, although a light shearing in the late winter will increase vigor and blooming. This plant is somewhat brittle, so it should not be used in areas with foot traffic.
