



QUERCUS EMORYI EMORY OAK

Emory oak is a slow growing evergreen shrub to medium sized tree, native from Texas to Arizona and south into Mexico. Emory oak is found in moist canyons, valleys and creek bottoms around 4500' elevations. The holly-like leaves are dark green, stiff and glossy with toothed margins. This plant is adaptable to varied soils as long as drainage is excellent. Although it is quite drought tolerant it appreciates supplemental irrigation in very hot summers. Emory oak prefers full sun exposures. Hardy to -10° F, USDA Zone 6.
