



RHUS TRILOBATA 'AUTUMN AMBER' PROSTRATE SUMAC

Similar to the three-leaf sumac in every way, this prostrate form has a trailing habit that rarely reaches over 3 feet in height and often will maintain a running height of only 6 inches. Extending out 5 to 6 feet or more, this extremely cold hardy plant covers a lot of ground and is useful for erosion control. The fall foliage is spectacular, with quite a show of various shades of orange and red. The leaves are very glabrous on this form as well. Some experts have indicated this plant is synonymous with *Rhus aromatica*.
