



VAUQUELINIA CORYMBOSA SSP. ANGUSTIFOLIA CHISOS ROSEWOOD

This subspecies of *V. corymbosa* is native to the Chisos Mountains of the Trans-Pecos range of southwest Texas occurring at elevations of 3000 to 5000 feet. Its leaves are more slender and sharply toothed than the species. This evergreen shrub is sometimes called the slim-leaf rosewood. Otherwise it has similar characteristics, with flattened clusters of white flowers produced in the spring. Chisos Rosewood can be sheered periodically to keep it smaller.
