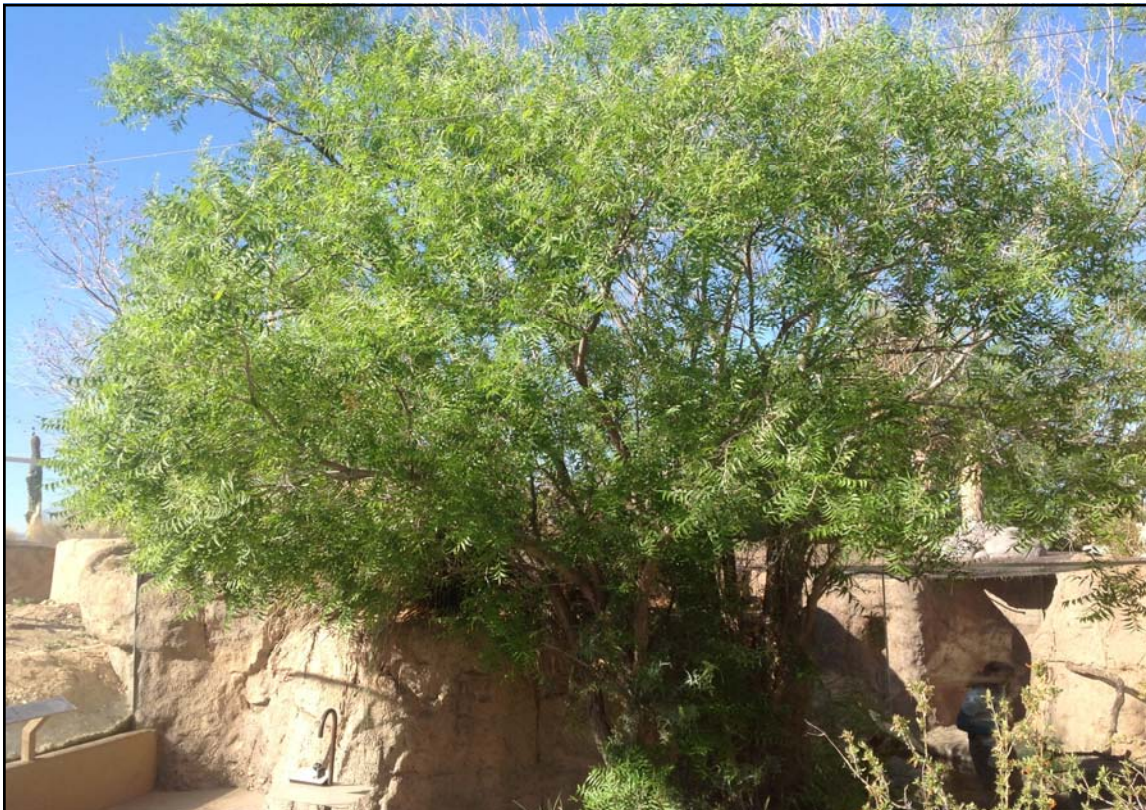




RHUS LANCEOLATA FLAME LEAF SUMAC

Native to most of the Southwest, this deciduous shrub or small tree has large, green, aromatic, compound leaves that turn a brilliant orange-red in the fall. Clusters of creamy white flowers are followed by hairy red-orange berries on female plants. Mature specimens are typically multi-trunked and short in stature but they may be trained into a single trunk standard. In the wild it suckers to form wide spreading colonies. Plant in full sun to part shade and provide good drainage. Hardy to -20° F.
