



SENNA OLIOGOPHYLLA OUTBACK SENNA

Synonym: *Cassia oliogophylla*. Many people have remarked that the coloration of this attractive shrub is similar to the high elevation native manzanita. Outback senna, an Australian native, has glossy green leaves and red stems. It grows to about 5 feet tall and wide, with a rounded form. In the springtime it is covered with yellow flowers, followed by decorative reddish-bronze seedpods. Outback senna should be planted in full sun and well-drained soil. It doesn't appear to be acclimated to cool, moist climates, but loves our hot dry heat. Its cold tolerance hasn't been determined, but it is probably hardy to the mid 20's F. USDA Zone 9.
