



THYMOPHYLLA PENTACHAETA GOLDEN DOGBANE

Synonym: *Dyssodia pentachaeta*. Plant just a few of these perennials in your garden, and watch those initial plants multiply and migrate to create clusters of golden-yellow flowers throughout the landscape. It provides wonderful fall and spring color, and even blooms through the winter if temperatures are mild. At high elevations it will provide color all summer. Golden dogbane has fragrant, lacy, bright green leaves. During the bloom season the foliage is hidden by masses of tiny gold daisy-like flowers. Golden dogbane reseeds profusely, but can be controlled easily if desired. Although individual plants are short-lived, new seedlings pop up to keep the population going. Plant Golden dogbane in full sun and well-drained soil. It is native to Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, and northern Mexico. It is an excellent plant for butterfly gardens, as it provides both nectar and food for larvae.
