



VIGUIERA PARISHII (DELTOIDEA) GOLDENEYE

This evergreen perennial is native to much of the Southwest and into Mexico, occurring at elevations from 1000 to 3500 feet. Goldeneye forms a dense round mound to about 4 feet across. The medium green leaves have a rough texture. The grayish-white stems are quite striking and provide an interesting backdrop for the bright green triangular shaped leaves. In the spring yellow daisy-like flowers rise above the foliage. *Viguiera parishii* should be planted in full sun and well-drained soils. It may be cut back in later winter to maintain a more dense and compact form.
