



YUCCA ELATA SOAP TREE YUCCA

Soaptree yucca ranges from southeast Arizona through New Mexico into west Texas, and south into Mexico. This treelike yucca can grow to 6-20 feet tall, with 2 to 5 branches. A spherical head of narrow, flexible leaves crowns each branch. The leaves measure from 1 to 3 feet long, with white margins and fuzzy white fibers. The showy flower spikes can reach up to 15 feet tall, producing masses of waxy white flowers in the late spring. Plant Soaptree yucca in full sun and well-drained soil. Hardy to -10° F, *Yucca elata* is a great choice for colder locations.
